
Getting Started: Navigating Resources After the Diagnosis

How to use the directory:

- 1. If you are not sure what service you are looking for, here are some ideas where you can identify areas of needs:
 - Diagnostic evaluation
 - IEP or 504 plan
 - Birth to Three plan
 - Next Step Guide
- 2. Start by going to the table on content on page four (4). Identify if the resource you are looking for is listed.
- 3. Do a search using key words by using the magnifying glass on the top right corner. This can be the name of a provider, type of service or county.
- 4. If there are multiple providers for the area of service you are looking for, be sure to start a log to help you track the information given to you. Providers tend to have a waiting list for services, and it can become overwhelming to remember who you have called.
